## **Impeachment: A Citizen's Guide by Cass R. Sunstein**

**(ISBN 9780674983793 \$7.99)**

Cass Sunstein considers actual and imaginable arguments for a president's removal, explaining why some cases are easy and others hard, why some arguments for impeachment are judicious and others not. In direct and approachable terms, he dispels the fog surrounding impeachment so that all Americans may use their ultimate civic authority wisely.

As Benjamin Franklin famously put it, Americans have a republic, if we can keep it. Preserving the Constitution and the democratic system it supports is the public's responsibility. One route the Constitution provides for discharging that duty—a route rarely traveled—is impeachment.

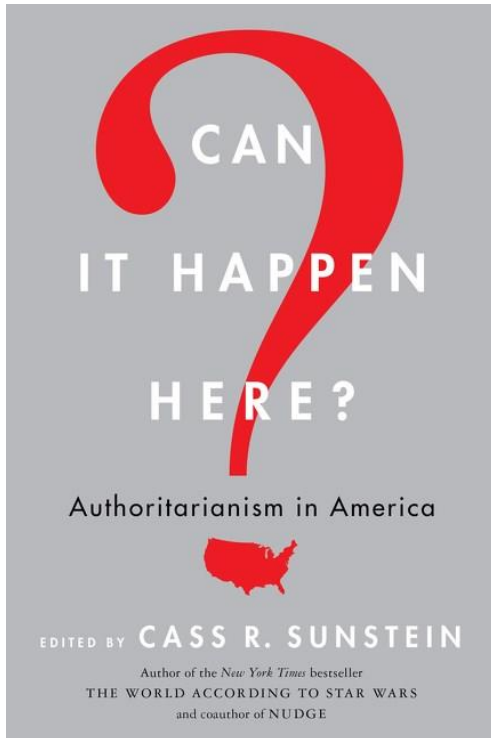
Cass R. Sunstein provides a succinct citizen's guide to an essential tool of self-government. He illuminates the constitutional design behind impeachment and emphasizes the people's role in holding presidents accountable. Despite intense interest in the subject, impeachment is widely misunderstood. Sunstein identifies and corrects a number of misconceptions. For example, he shows that the Constitution, not the House of Representatives, establishes grounds for impeachment, and that the president can be impeached for abuses of power that do not violate the law. Even neglect of duty counts among the "high crimes and misdemeanors" delineated in the republic's foundational document. Sunstein describes how impeachment helps make sense of our constitutional order, particularly the framers' controversial decision to install an empowered executive in a nation deeply fearful of kings.

With an eye toward the past and the future, *Impeachment: A Citizen's Guide* considers a host of actual and imaginable arguments for a president's removal, explaining why some cases are easy and others hard, why some arguments for impeachment have been judicious and others not. In direct and approachable terms, it dispels the fog surrounding impeachment so that Americans of all political convictions may use their ultimate civic authority wisely.

## **To Change the Church: Pope Francis and the Future of Catholicism by Ross Douthat (ISBN 9781501146923 \$26.00)**

A New York Times columnist and one of America's leading conservative thinkers consider Pope Francis's efforts to change the church he governs.



Born Jorge Mario Bergoglio in 1936, today Pope Francis is the 266th pope of the Roman Catholic Church. Pope Francis's stewardship of the Church, while perceived as a revelation by many, has provoked division throughout the world. "If a conclave were to be held today," one Roman source told The New Yorker, "Francis would be lucky to get ten votes."

In *To Change the Church*, Douthat explains why the particular debate Francis has opened—over communion for the divorced and the remarried—is so dangerous: How it cuts to the heart of the larger argument over how Christianity should respond to the sexual revolution and modernity itself, how it promises or

threatens to separate the church from its own deep past, and how it divides Catholicism along geographical and cultural lines. Douthat argues that the Francis era is a crucial experiment for all of Western civilization, which is facing resurgent external enemies (from ISIS to Putin) even as it struggles with its own internal divisions, its decadence, and self-doubt. Whether Francis or his critics are right won't just determine whether he ends up as a hero or a tragic figure for Catholics. It will determine whether he's a hero, or a gambler who's betraying both his church and his civilization into the hands of its enemies.

## **I Have the Right To: A High School Survivor's Story of Sexual Assault, Justice, and Hope by Chessy Prout and Jenn Abelson (ISBN 9781534414433 \$18.99)**

In this candid memoir, a young survivor tells her searing, visceral story of sexual assault in high school, justice, and healing.

Chessy Prout made national news when she shed her anonymity in 2016 for a groundbreaking interview with Savannah Guthrie on the TODAY Show. Guthrie won a

Chessy was a freshman St. Paul's School, an institution consistently ranked one of the best high schools in the country. At St. Paul's, a sadistic tradition exists -- the "Senior Salute." A senior boy chooses a freshman girl to pursue with the goal of having sex with her. Chessy was one of those girls.

Nearly one in five girls' ages 14 to 17 has been the victim of a sexual assault or attempted sexual assault. For college age women, that number increases to one in FOUR. Chessy's story is not an anomaly, but one which we must vigilantly shine a spotlight on, and guard against repeating. This book is a tool for young people to learn about consent and our individual rights to bodily autonomy.

Chessy has partnered with the acclaimed Boston

Globe reporter Jenn Abelson, of the famed Spotlight investigative team, the same team responsible for the groundbreaking investigation into the Catholic Church in the early aughts. That investigative piece was made into the award-winning feature film Spotlight. Jenn's Pulitzer Prize winning-work includes a long term series investigation into abuse at elite prep schools which is how she became familiar with Chessy's story. To tell Chessy's story, she moved to the Prouts' town for three months, all while having access to Chessy's personal journals during the time of the assault and beyond.

Together with PAVE (Promoting Awareness | Victim Empowerment)-- the only national nonprofit that works both to shatter the silence and prevent sexual violence through social advocacy, education and survivor support -- Chessy created the social media campaign #IHaveTheRightTo, a hashtag that has generated over 4 million imprints.
